Facts about the Sanitary District and drainage canal:

The main and water power channel is 40 miles long.  
Length of river, lake to Robey street, 6 miles.  
Length river diversion channel, 13 miles.  
Width main channel, Robey street to Summit:  
Bottom, 110 feet; top, 198.  
Width main channel, Summit to Willow Springs:  
Bottom, 202 feet; top, 290.  
Width main channel, Willow Springs to Lockport (rock section): Bottom, 160 feet; top, 182.  
Width river diversion channel: Bottom, 200 feet.  
Minimum depth of water in main channel, 22 feet.  
Current in earth sections, 1 1/4 miles per hour.  
Current in rock sections, 1.9 miles per hour.  
Present capacity of canal, 300,000 cubic feet per minute.  
Total amount of excavation, 42,229,635 cubic yards.  
The north shore channel, extending from Lawrence avenue to Lake Michigan, in the village of Wilmette, is about 8 miles long with a water depth of 13.6 feet.  
Construction of the Sag canal to drain the Calumet region was begun in the summer of 1911.  
Sag channel will be 22 miles long when work is finished.
