


The most expensive automobile in America—the famous Studebaker Gold Car, valued at \$30,000, is on exhibition this week at the local Studebaker salesrooms, Michigan avenue and Twenty-first street. Having played the big league motor show circuit, starting at New York last January and gone the rounds of all the big cities, this aristocrat of the exhibition ring was returned to Chicago yesterday that it may help to interest visitors along the row.

The Gold Studebaker is a Series 18, six-cylinder, seven-passenger touring car, with the distinctive Victoria top in place. About 400 ounces of 24-carat gold were used in finishing the car. Mounted on the golden chassis is a standard touring body, also finished in gold and glistening white enamel. The Victoria top is of white leather, while the brackets supporting the top are all gold plated.

Members of the good roads committee of the Illinois Manufacturers' Association have given unanimous endorsement to the Danville platform of the Illinois Highway Improvement Association and the suggested amendment providing for the payment of the entire interest and principal of the proposed \$60,000,000 bond issue from the collection of increased motor vehicle state license fees. The committee also approves an appropriation by the legislature to secure Illinois' share of the amount allotted under the federal aid road act.
