ULTIMATUM FROM ENGLAND.

CHINA DEGRADES THE VICEROY OF SECHUEN UPON DEMAND. British Warships Were Ready to Act if the Viceroy Did Not—The Viceroy Must be Degraded Because He Did Not Protect Missionaries—Chinese Want Vengeance—A Massacre Feared at Ku-Cheng Unless Prompt Steps are Taken.

Washington, Sept. 30.—Minister Denham addressed the State Department from London to-day as follows:—: Imperial decree issued. Abstract responsibility for Seachuan reports has been assumed by the Viceroy Liu care.

London, Sept. 30.—A despatch from London says that the British Government is demanding that the Viceroy of Seachuan issue within two weeks a proclamation degrading the Viceroy of Seachuan, otherwise the British admiral in the same despatch says that an American commission, consisting of the United States Consul at Tien-Tsin, the American officer, and the interpreter of the State Legation, is about to start for the scene of the outrages.

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
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
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
