

IN ALL THE COURTS.

THE SUPERIOR, SUPREME AND FEDERAL COURTS IN SESSION.

The Calling of Calendars, Sentencing Criminals and Making Young Lawyers the Order of the Day.

The Supreme Court met in its April session in this city yesterday at 2 p. m. Chief Justice Beatty presided, with Justices Fox, McFarland, Sharpstein and Works to assist. The first business on the docket was motions, and after these were disposed of in an hour or more the class of applicants for admission to practice law was called up and examined. The following fledgling jurists composed the class:

Today the report of the bench will be handed down, showing how many of the above are successful applicants for the legal sheepskin.

For today the following cases are set to be heard by the judges sitting in banc: Perkins vs. Cooper et al.; Metz vs. California Southern Railroad Company; Southern Pacific Railroad Company vs. Coble; Alhambra Addition Water Company vs. Mayberry; Kerckhoff-Cuzner Mill and Lumber Company vs. Olmstead et al.; Pendleton et al. vs. Cline et al.; DeGuyer et al. vs. Banning; Page et al. vs. Board of Supervisors Los Angeles county.

In the Superior Court all the departments except No. 1 were engaged in calling the civil term trial calendar. The number of cases is much smaller than there were called last summer, showing that the docket is getting cleared up.

In Department 1, the case of the people against W. C. Chornicle and W. A. Gardner, of Castac cañon, charged with the murder of two men came up, and Thursday was set as the time to plead.

In the case of the people against C. C. Jaxthamer, tomorrow is set to plead.

H. Chanaron, the man who robbed the Kiefer liquor house on North Main street, was sentenced to 3 years in San Quentin. Manuel Balazquez, who tried to shoot Mrs. Graham and her sister for refusing to marry him, was sentenced to 2 years at San Quentin.

The case of the people against Felipe Chavez for the murder of Charlie Glass is on trial. Chavez was tried for this crime a few weeks ago and the jury disagreed. The story is too familiar to need repetition.

In the United States Court Avery Clinton was examined on a charge of sending obscene letters through the mails to Charlotte Shiells, of Saticoy, and to her father and mother, George Crampton, postmaster at Newhall, identified the letter as having passed through the mails. The girl and her father testified to the receipt of the letter sent to the girl through the mails. The defendant went on the stand and identified the letter and the signature as his and confessed that he sent it. He made the statement that he was not in his right mind when he wrote the letter, that he was suffering from extreme vexation, disappointment and distraction, or he would not have written as he wrote. The inference seemed to be that he was in love with the girl and had been refused. The examination was before Commissioner Van Dyke, who held Clinton in the sum of \$1,000 to stand trial. He is in jail awaiting trial.

Olin Welborn, Esq., of San Diego, was admitted to practice in this court on motion of J. S. Chapman, Esq.

In the case of H. D. Harrison against Peter Ulrichs, the Los Balbas cases, an order was entered by stipulation that the writ of error sued out be withdrawn, and that no further writ of this nature will be asked for, and that the costs be assessed as agreed upon.

STORY OF A WATCH.

How It Turned Up After Being Lost in a Storm.

At 4:30 o'clock yesterday afternoon a middle-aged man named Thomas Waite, from Newhall, was taken before Justice Austin for arraignment upon a charge of grand larceny preferred against him by Thos. Gordon. The complainant, Gordon, an oil-well driller, residing at No. 404 Beaudry avenue, testified that he had known the defendant for the last ten years or more. On or about November 1, 1890, the defendant was employed by him at Wiley cañon, some four miles from Newhall, for a few days while boring an oil well. The witness at that time had a gold hunting-case watch, which he purchased from Nordlinger, the Main-street jeweler, for \$90 in 1884. While they were at work a wind storm came up, and his watch which had been in his fob pocket, was lost in some inexplicable manner. Gordon told the defendant of his loss, and work was suspended for three or four hours in order to look for the missing watch, but although every plank of the 20-foot square boarding around the derrick was turned over, the watch was not found. The defendant did not appear to take any interest in the search at the time, but no suspicion rested upon him. Soon afterwards Gordon left the place and Waite remained at work upon the well. On his return to town Gordon told Nordlinger's clerk of the loss of his watch and thought no more of the matter. As he passed by the store yesterday morning, however, the clerk called him in, and told him that he had seen the missing watch in the possession of a man who answered to Waite's description, and he at once started out in pursuit of him. About 3:40 o'clock he saw Waite on Second street, and at once called upon Officer Farmer to accompany him while he demanded the watch. Waite however, denied all knowledge of the watch and as there seemed to be a likelihood of a scene on the street, the officer requested both men to accompany him to the station. Gordon did not know the number of his watch and had not seen it since he lost it, but said he "could swear on a stack of bibles it was his" when one was shown to him, and added that he "would know the feel of it in the dark."

Jacob Abramson, the next witness, was a watchmaker and salesman at Nordlinger's jewelry store, on Main street. He readily identified the watch, and producing a small magnifying glass, such as is used by jewelers, he offered it to the court and showed on the case some tiny engraving, which was found to read, "Sept. 3, 1884. Referring to his sales book, the witness showed the court an entry on that date of the sale of the watch to Gordon, and the number of the case, "171-452," corresponded with that in the book. He then stated that Waite

brought it to the store yesterday morning and had a crystal put in, and that he questioned Waite as to how he came by it. Waite replied that he had traded a colt for it at Newhall.

Officers Farmer and Wallin testified to the effect that the defendant had made a similar statement in the detective's office at the station, and the prosecution rested.

The defendant, Thomas Waite, then took the stand on his own behalf. He stated that he traded a mare colt for the watch about four months ago, with a Spaniard who said he won it in a newspaper lottery. He did not know who the Spaniard was, nor from whom he had bought the colt in the first place, and in fact was unable to give an account of the transaction except that it occurred on the flats near his house, and that no one was present at the time. After listening patiently to his story, the court held him to answer to the charge of grand larceny in the Superior Court, under bonds in the sum of \$1,000.
