



NOTICE OF STOCKHOLDERS' MEETING.

IN PURSUANCE OF RESOLUTIONS OF THE BOARD of Directors of the Los Angeles and Pacific Railway Company, duly passed on the 9th day of January, 1890, a meeting of the stockholders of said company is hereby called to meet on the 12th day of April, 1890, at 10 o'clock a. m., at No. 44 North Spring Street (the same being the place where the Board of Directors of said company usually hold their meetings), in the City of Los Angeles, State of California, for the purpose of authorizing the creation of a bonded indebtedness of said company, consisting of three hundred bonds, of said company, numbered from one to three hundred (said two numbers inclusive), \$25 bonds are to be first mortgage bonds. Said bonds are to be for one thousand dollars each, and are to be all of the same date, and all payable in thirty years from date, and are to bear interest at the rate of six per cent per annum, with interest coupons attached, thereon, to be paid annually, and for the securing of said bonds to further authorize the execution of a mortgage or trust deed, covering all of the corporate property and franchises of said company, owned at the date of the execution of said mortgage or trust deed, or that may thereafter be acquired by said company, during the running of said bonds to maturity.
