The Report of the Board of Public Works.

More Delay in Fixing the Second-Street Road.

A Meeting of the Sewer Committee of the Council.

The City Advertisements Now Being Published—A Number of Sewer Ordinance Notices.

The Board of Public Works met yesterday and decided to make the following report to the Council on Monday:

In regard to petitions for grading that portion of San Fernando road within the city limits, and also for the building of a bridge across the Arroyo Seco, the board reports as follows: We have given the section referred to a thorough inspection, in company with the City Engineer, and find that the supervisors have just completed a good road, in and up to the city line. We recommend that proceedings be inaugurated looking to the continuation of this road within the city limits, by the construction of a turnpike road thirty feet in width, with graded surface similar to Mission street, said road to connect with Walnut street by a pile bridge across the Arroyo Seco. Looking to this end we recommend that the City Engineer be instructed to make surveys and present plans and specifications for this work; said plans and specifications to be preceded by an ordinance of intention to establish the grade of said San Fernando road.

In regard to the communication of the Chief of Police calling attention to the dangerous condition of the Second-street cable railway, and which matter was referred to the board, we recommend, in view of the fact that the road is about to be sold, under foreclosure proceedings, that no action be taken at present. On petition of Joseph Hyams, asking to be allowed to take a few loads of gravel from Lopez street, recommend the same be referred to the Street Superintendent, with power to act.

On the petition of the Evening Express Company, asking to be allowed to erect a bulletin board in front of their circulating office on Second street between Spring and Main, recommend the same be granted, the work to be done under the supervision of the Street Superintendent.

On the petition of Mrs. Mary P. Richardson et al., asking that the Council advertise for bids for the grading of Soto street between Brooklyn and Wabash avenue, we recommend that the petition be filed and that no action be taken, as the petitioners should ask that original proceedings be instituted in accordance with the desire of petitioners, under the provisions of the Vrooman act.

On the petition of J. Mills Davies, asking that the grade of Old Temple street, from Burtz to Bellevue avenue, and also of Bellevue avenue, from Old Temple to west city line, be established, we report as follows: In view of the fact that Old Temple street, between Burtz and Bellevue avenue, is now being put in good condition on a good grade by the Street Superintendent, we recommend that the ordinance, as presented by the City Engineer, establishing the grade of Bellevue avenue, from Old Temple street to the west city limits, be passed.

On the petition of E. Piermont, asking to be allowed to grade Twenty-third street, in front of his property—225 feet—we recommend the same be granted, and the City Attorney be instructed to draft an ordinance granting permission to do the work by private contract.

SEWER COMMITTEE.

Recommendations to be Made to the Council Monday.

The sewer committee met yesterday and decided to make the following recommendations:

That the petition of A. McNally asking permission to connect with the Main-street sewer be granted. Also suggested that permits to connect with the public sewers be obtained direct from the Street Superintendent.

In the matter of the Temple-street sewer, recommended that action be postponed one week; also recommended that Mr. Solano be allowed to put in iron pipe connection under the sidewalk.

That the bids of Erick Bros. be accepted for constructing three sections of the central intercepting sewer as follows: Section one, at the rate of \$5.14 per lineal foot; section two, at the rate of \$4.93 per lineal foot; section three at the rate of \$4.53 per lineal foot; extra excavation at the rate of 45 cents per cubic yard on all three sections. Also that the City Attorney be instructed to prepare contract and bond as per above.
