

CITY MATTERS.

The Police Commission Holds a Meeting.

A Number of Saloon Licenses Granted.

Last Month's Work of the Police Department.

The Fire Commissioners—A Number of City Advertisements Now Being Published.

The Board of Police Commissioners met yesterday afternoon in the Mayor's office, Hon. H. T. Hazard presiding and Messrs Collins, Dexter, Knox and Lewis present.

A communication was received from the City Clerk informing the board that the Council had authorized it to procure a range, etc., at a cost not to exceed \$110, and also to expend not to exceed \$50 for the purchase of the necessary supplies, pending advertisement for contracts to furnish the same during the rest of the year, and the same was referred to the committee appointed to look into the matter.

The applications for transfers of licenses of Fred Arbogast, No. 517 North Main street from Rudolph Strigg, and L. E. Meredith, No. 148 Mission road, from Garvin & Meredith, were granted.

The application of Louis Roth for permission to obtain a license for a new saloon at No. 245 East First street, was referred to the Chief, under the rule, as was also that of H. Cooney for a similar privilege at No. 1302 Alameda street.

The petition of D. J. McCarthy for a transfer of the license to him, now in the name of McCarthy & O'Malley, at No. 107 North Main street, was granted.

The application of F. Casper for a transfer of his license from No. 705 Upper Main street, to No. 122 West Third street, was granted, and that of Messrs. Steinicke & Bruning for a retail license at No. 234 Los Angeles street, was also granted.

Demands amounting in the aggregate to \$51.88, were approved as read. The Chief presented his monthly report of the work of his department during the month of April, which contained the following particulars: Number of arrests made: Assault, 4; begging, 4; battery, 23; burglary, 3; attempted burglary, 1; carrying concealed weapons, 5; cruelty to animals, 2; committing nuisance, 1; drunks, 84; disturbing the peace, 33; false pretenses, 3; fast driving, 4; forgery, 1; gambling, 13; violating hitching ordinance, 11; grand larceny, 2; petit larceny, 13; violating license law, 8; selling lottery tickets, 17; misdemeanors, 31; malicious mischief, 1; robberies, 4; suspicious person, 1; vagrants, 11; total, 277. In addition to these, 3 witnesses, 2 insane persons, and 23 sick and injured persons were taken to the station; 33 lodgers were accommodated for the night; 8 lost children restored to their parents, and 42 loose horses and cows were impounded, making a grand total of 388.

Among the miscellaneous duties performed by the department were the following: Warrants served, 34; jurors summoned, 247; witnesses subpoenaed, 144; attachments served, 4. Thirty-four dead animals were reported and buried. The patrol wagon traveled 307 miles. The prisoners in the chain gang worked an aggregate of 830 days, while 3,299 meals were furnished to the city's prisoners. The Police Surgeon treated 612 persons, and 107 destitute people were cared for. Fifty letters and telegrams of inquiry were received and answered. Property to the value of \$4,532.72 was recovered by the detective force. Officer Valencia, a specialist mentioned by the Chief for the courage he displayed in stopping a runaway team, and the general department of the force was reported as excellent. The report was approved and filed.

The application of Clerk Ray E. Cottle for eight days' leave of absence from May 2d was granted, on the recommendation of the Chief, the other clerks having promised to do his work in the meantime, and the Chief was authorized to grant leaves of absence, without pay, in the future.

Health Officer McGowan and Superintendent of Buildings Mchunore appeared before the board and presented plans for a receiving hospital for the approval of the board, which embraced the battery room of the fire department and part of the jail. Chief Glass objected vigorously to parting with the drunk cell, which he insisted was a necessary adjunct to the jail, and which could not be transferred from its present location. After a general and lengthy discussion of the matter, the board adjourned to the city jail, and after viewing the premises, approved the plans after the drunk cell had been eliminated therefrom, and the commissioners dispersed.

THE FIRE COMMISSION.

A Small Amount of Business Transacted Yesterday.

At the meeting of the Board of Fire Commissioners, held yesterday morning in the Mayor's office, there were present Mayor Hazard, in the chair, and Messrs. Kuhrtz, Keeffe and Lovell.

On motion of Mr. Keeffe a number of requisitions for supplies needed by the department were approved as presented by the Chief Engineer.

The petition of M. Wilson for permission to erect a stable on block "A," of the Desoyner tract, was granted under the rule, as was also a petition to erect a blacksmith shop on lot 5 of Hazard's subdivision of lot 16, Griffin's addition.

A communication was received from the City Clerk with reference to the new ordinance providing for the abolishment of iron doors in buildings, and the ordinance having been passed by the Council the same was placed on file.

The proposals of D. F. Donegan and Louis Schwartz, offering to erect and rent engine houses, were received from the Council, and on motion of Col. Moore were returned to that body, after having been read, with the recommendation that both be rejected and proposals be re-advertised for.

After approving the demand of the Sunset Telephone Company for \$36, the board adjourned.
