Some of the justices of the county have been dealing in a rather summary manner with vagrants, trying them without permitting the defendant to have a jury in some cases...

This is an appeal from the judgment of the city justice's court of the city of Los Angeles, convicting defendant of vagrancy. The only point raised by appellant is that the court below erred in denying trial by jury to defendant.

Section 689 of the penal code provides as follows: "No person can be convicted of a public offense unless by the verdict of a jury, accepted and recorded by the court, or upon a plea of guilty, or upon judgment against him upon a demurrer in the case mentioned in section 1011, or upon a judgment of a court, a jury having been waived in a criminal case not amounting to felony."
