His Plea Yesterday for Reduction of Bail.

District Attorney Kelly and Damron's Proposed Trip to San Francisco—Taken under Adversement.

Lawyer Damron was brought before Judge Cheney yesterday on a motion to reduce the present amount of his bonds, which now figure up to \$9,000. When a vulgar malefactor is brought in a court of justice on a criminal charge, there is but little sympathy or interest manifested for him, but when a person of the undoubted ability of Mr. Damron is arraigned at the bar for that most subtle of all crimes—forgery, it cannot fail to attract the attention of the public, and the public was there as usual.

Mr. Damron introduced a number of witnesses to show that he had remained in hiding not for the purpose of running away and thus despoiling his bondsmen, but because he was afraid that one particular member of the district attorney's staff intended him no good, and would cause his arrest.

If Damron's story can be credited, Mr. Hardesty did not act only as a public officer in the matter of his arrests and re-arrests, but more as a persecutor. He has been able to prove, at all events, that the district attorney was aware of his visit north, and that nothing was to be done against him if he returned by the following Tuesday.
