**THE BUNCOERS.**

They Successfully Invoke the Aid of a Technicality.

The bunco men concerned in the attempt to rob Judge Haskins, the prominent New York politician and attorney who visited this city nearly two years ago, have successfully invoked a legal technicality. The matter has been brought to notice by the following dispatch from San Francisco: "The supreme court today affirmed the judgment granting a new trial to the Los Angeles bunco steerer, Frank Rose, on the ground that the court erred in admitting the testimony of a detective as an expert in describing a game of bunco in general, and not the particular game in which the victim lost his money, especially as the description was from information given the detective, who was not an eye-witness."
