In the above tables ten counties show a falling off in population of 18,468. These are Amador, with a loss of 596; Calaveras, 234; El Dorado, 1,807; Marysville, 522; Mono, 5,483; Nevada, 3,690; Plumas, 1,264; Sierra, 1,761; Trinity, 1,066; and Tuolumne, 1,775.


