This bank will distribute to its agents a sufficient quantity of red five cent deposit stamps, a little larger than the ordinary two cent postage stamp, and each purchaser of one five cent deposit stamp is furnished with a stamp and deposit book free, beautifully colored, with ten pages, each page ruled for twenty stamps, and when filled represents one dollar, which is torn out by the depositor and sent to the bank, either directly or through one of the agents; the bank then issues to them a regular credit any pass book with the credit of a dollar, which will be sent to the depositor or agent; the depositor then begins to fill another stamp book with stamps which is sent or brought to the bank when full and so on.
