ORANGE COUNTY PAYS.

IT SQUARES ITS ACCOUNT WITH LOS ANGELES.

The Report Made to the Supervisors on the Settlement—The Money Ordered Paid to the Treasurer.

At the meeting of the board of supervisors yesterday the following report was submitted from the chairman of the board and the district attorney: To the Honorable, the Board of Supervisors, Los Angeles County:

GENTLEMEN—In accordance with the action of your board taken relative thereto on the 22d day of April, 1891, the undersigned, on the 23d day of April, 1891, proceeded to Santa Ana, Orange county, to receive payment of the sum of \$14,081, the amount found due Los Angeles county up to March 11, 1889, by the commissioners in partition between Los Angeles county and Orange county.

On examination we found that there had been filed with the board of supervisors of Orange county, on January 26, 1891, for and on behalf of Los Angeles county, a claim for \$14,081, being the amount found due Los Angeles county by said commission up to March 11, 1889, after deducting \$1500, the proportionate share of Orange county to the improvements on the county poor farm allowed said Orange county, by your board prior to the filing of said claim.

We found that on February 9, 1891, the board of supervisors of Orange county had allowed and ordered a warrant drawn for \$12,524.58, and on April 21, 1891, had allowed and ordered a warrant drawn for \$1556.42, making the full amount of said claim, both warrants being payable to Los Angeles county.

These warrants we received and now hold subject to your direction, Mr. Perry signing the auditor's receipt book therefor. We took no receipt for the \$1500 above mentioned, it being unnecessary, the warrants above mentioned paying the claim referred to in full.

Further, we ordered from the clerk of Orange county a certified copy of all claims filed by Los Angeles county, and of the minutes of the board of supervisors of Orange county, showing all the proceedings taken by said board relative to the settlement of the accounts between the two counties.

As to the claim of Los Angeles county against Orange county for \$11,375.42 for moneys advanced after March 11, 1889, we found that on February 2, 1891, Orange county refused payment of same and returned the claim to Los Angeles county.

The warrants above mentioned as having been received by us have no bearing on the said claim for \$11,375.42. Respectfully submitted,

The warrants were deposited as ordered, and receipts therefor were obtained. The board then adjourned until today at 10 a. m.
