Strawberries are arriving more plentifully, and find ready sale at more reasonable prices. Today's receipts were six cars of oranges and fourteen chests of strawberries. The dried fruit market is very quiet. Large prunes continue to be the only variety which attracts any attention.

Chicago Grain Market. CHICAGO, April 8.—Wheat active and decidedly higher. The opening was 3/4 to 1/2 per bushel up on account of shorts covering and higher cables; eased off 1/4, advanced 1/4 on liberal orders and the Ohio crop report, showing the condition of winter wheat to be only 69 per cent against 80 per cent in December. Market irregular, and closed firm, 3 1/2 higher than yesterday. Receipts, 30,000 bushels; shipments, 47,000 bushels.
