Last evening the earthly remains of Byron Adonis, one of the most advanced adepts of the circle of known Theosophists...

The remains of Byron Adonis, who was a man 55 years of age, were received in this city on Thursday from San Francisco...

THE CEREMONIES Took place in the reception room of the Rosedale crematory at 6 o'clock last evening...

THE OPENING INVOCATION The ceremonies were then solemnly opened by the Buddhists present...

"Buddham saranam gak Khammi, Dhammam saranam gak Khammi, Sangham saranam gak Khammi."

Translated into English, the invocation is as given below:

"I take my refuge in the Buddha, I take my refuge in the Dhamma, I take my refuge in the Order."

The invocation was repeated three times, and the second invocation was given three times, as follows:

"Anikha vata sambhara uppadava; abhinna uppagata nimguanti tassa vapasamo sukho."

This invocation, translated into English, contains the following beautiful thoughts:

"How transient are all component things! Their nature is to be born and die; coming, they go; and then is best, when each has ceased, and all is rest."

A lotus flower was then dropped on the bier, with the prayer "O mani pad mahan," to him of the Lotus and the Jewel.

THE INCINERATION. The company then passed around the bier with bowed heads, and it was silently removed to the crematory.

The doors were opened and after casting more lotus flowers and lilies therein, it was placed in the furnace. Fires had been steadily maintained under the furnace for forty-eight hours, and it was heated to 1800 degrees.

CHAMBER OF COMMERCE.

A Meeting Yesterday of the Directors.

Outside Banks to Join the Clearing House.

The board of directors of the chamber of commerce met yesterday afternoon. There were present Directors McGarvin, Graff, Francisco, Baker, Klokke, Jevne, Forman, Johnson, Edwards, and Director McGarvin occupied the chair.

The secretary tendered a financial statement showing a balance of \$911.25. Bills to the amount of \$372.35 were read and ordered paid.

Under the head of reports of special committees Director Johnson reported concerning the visit of the committee, consisting of himself, Chas. Forman and E. F. C. Klokke, of the banks which were not members of the Clearing House association, asking them to join.

A communication from Senator Felton with regard to the bills in behalf of San Pedro offered by him in the senate was read, and the secretary was instructed to express the thanks of the board to the senator.

A letter from Jay L. Torrey with regard to the Torrey bankrupt bill and its endorsement by the chamber was read; it was decided that the chamber should not endorse that nor any other law without subjecting it to a thorough study.

A communication from the executive committee of the California Nicaragua convention was read, asking that the chamber appoint delegates to attend the national Nicaragua canal convention to take place in St. Louis June 2d.


