BIG FIRE AT FOREST CITY.

No. 2 Shaft of the Hillside Iron and Coal Company Destroyed. Loss \$75,000.

Special to the Scranton Tribune. FOREST CITY, Pa., May 15.—At 3:15 this afternoon, after the mine operations had ceased for the day's work at No. 2 shaft of the Hillside Coal and Iron company, a disastrous fire occurred at the top of the shaft which was surrounded by a fan house, engine room and boiler room.

The generators and switch board were destroyed and the engines badly damaged. The flames spread rapidly, as a very high wind was blowing, and enveloped the boiler house which nearly ruined the engine room.

The fan house which was destroyed supplied the current of air for the shaft which will necessitate the idleness of that place for a short time, while arrangements will be perfected for the carrying of air to the slope from the No. 2 shaft fan house which was about ten rods from the burning buildings and which escaped the flame.

The glad news which was received today that this colliery would work three-quarter time made many happy, but the happiness was abruptly ended by the calamity, which will throw about 500 men and boys out of employment for several weeks while the plant is being rebuilt.
