DEATH OF DR. DRUMM.

A Former Rector of Trinity Church Passes Away. The Rev. Thomas Drumm, D. D., for several years before the war an esteemed rector of Trinity Episcopal church, in this city, recently died in New York after a short illness. For some years he had been engaged as a chaplain, aiding immigrants from England and Ireland, and assisting them in various ways.

After leaving Carbondale Dr. Drumm became the rector of a church in Trenton, N. J. During the war he was a chaplain in the army, where he gained an honorable record. He was a man of refined tastes, highly educated, the loved and trusted friend of all his people. He passed a long and useful life and left a considerable estate to the benefit of his church and to the support of more than three score years and ten. When called away he was about 73 years of age. He leaves one daughter and a son, Rev. Thomas J. Drumm, of Concord, N. H.
