Dead Miner's Friends Accuse Ashland Hospital Authorities of Cruelty.

CLAIM THAT BODY WAS WARM

Affidavits Made That When the Supposed Corpse Reached Home the Toes Twitched--Dr. Biddle Denies the Story.

Shamokin, Jan. 9.—The residents of Excelsior, a small mining village near here, are greatly excited. They declare that Lucas Homiak, an injured mine worker, was shipped to his home in an ice box before life had really left the unfortunate man's body.

Lucas Homiak, aged 30 years, a hardy Russian mine-worker at Excelsior, while working in the colliery there, Tuesday afternoon, was buried beneath a heavy fall of coal and was removed to the miners' hospital, at Ashland, on the evening train.

Shortly after midday, however, Mrs. Homiak was informed that her husband was dead, and she decided to bring his remains home with her.

ICE HAD MELTED.
