PASSED UPON BY SUPREME COURT DECISION IN THE FAMOUS STEERE-OAKLEY CASE.

Reargument Has Been Refused—Local Case Reversed in the Case of the Electric City Land and Improvement Company—Reargument Denied in the Case of Gavigan Against the Atlantic Refining Company—Some of the Other Cases.

At Pittsburgh Monday the Supreme court handed down decisions in a large number of important civil cases. In the much tried suit of Steere against Oakley a decision was rendered reversing a decision of the lower court and affirming a motion for reargument. The suit is based on the claim of C. C. Steere, of Kingsley, that in the settlement of debt represented by a mortgage D. K. Oakley overreached him to the extent of \$800.
