Of Jonas Long's Sons, Who Goes as an Alternate Delegate from Lackawanna County, to the Republican National Convention at Philadelphia Next Week.

That a man is what he makes himself is attested in the life and character of Arthur Long. Strong and sturdy in disposition and nature; a frank, open temperament, an eye quick to perceive attributes of character that he has acquired from nature and by study, and which have brought within his sphere a host of friends and acquaintances.

On the 9th of December, 1856, Colonel Arthur Long first saw the light of day in the city of Wilkes-Barre, then no more than a big village, but with a commercial prestige far-reaching in its influence. His father, Jonas Long, was one of the city's studious and most influential residents.
