COUNCIL MEETING.

Select council met last evening. Although less than \$100 of the year's appropriation for the fire department remains the requisitions of the hose companies were granted. The ordinances appropriating \$1,200 for the North Church street bridge and annexing territory to the First sewer district were passed on final readings. Resolutions were adopted as follows: That damages of \$400 and \$300 allowed Lunny and Mullady respectively be ratified; that clerk advertise for bids for paving North Church street to Canaan street; that transfers of certain appropriations be made in accordance with the controller's report; that petition of Shell avenue residents for a thirty-five foot street be received and request granted. Mr. Mannion's resolution for the opening of Battle avenue was defeated and then referred to the street committee. This precipitated a wordy war. A resolution was also adopted instructing the city engineer to make plan and profile of Park street from Lincoln avenue to property of John Gibbs. An ordinance for the construction of a sewer on South Church street and Ninth avenue was introduced and ordered printed. Mr. Mannion then made an unsuccessful effort to resurrect a pigeon-holed ordinance providing for three fire hydrants in the Fourth. His failure prompted the accusation that some of the aldermen are trying to block needful legislation.
