AMERICAN SHAW MANUFACTURE.—The Bay State Mills have recently sold 100 cases, numbering nearly or quite 5,000 shawls, for the Canada market, to a regular dealer there, who can afford to pay a duty of 12 per cent, and sell his goods along side of British productions at a profit. The production of shawls will be as follows:—James & Co., nearly all long shawls of beautiful designs, 30,000; Bay State Mills, the great printers in this work, 285,000; Waterloo Co., 22,000; Empire State Mills, 30,000; Peacedale Mill, Duncan & Cunningham, and one or two smaller makers, say 25,000—making a total of 492,000, or nearly half a million of the medium and better class of goods, produced in this country in a single year.—Newark Advertiser.
