FROM WINCHESTER, VA., Feb. 24, 1862. The Winchester Republican says that the reports published of disasters result to the health and lives of the Confederates, under the recent movements of Gen. Jackson, are grossly exaggerated. Many of them are sick, but there has been comparatively few deaths.

GEN. ZOLLICOFFER'S REMAINS. NASHVILLE, TENN., Jan. 31st, 1862. A private dispatch from Bowling Green says that the remains of Gen. Zollicoffer and Col. Belle Peyton, Jr., were received at our outpost this evening. They will reach here to-morrow under a military escort.

The Norfolk Day Book of the 21st inst., contains the following extracts from the New York Herald of the 1st inst., relative to the Foreign news brought over by the steamer Africa from Liverpool, with dates to the 19th ultimo: The Commissioners of Customs have received orders to permit the exportation of all articles of war munitions against which the prohibition was subject matter.

Liverpool still continued to be placarded with papers calling on the news to second any public reception to Mason and Sidel. The presence of Sidel was anxiously looked for in Paris, while the London press has been full of reports of an attempt to defend the public character and conduct of the man who is now in the hands of the rebels.
