THE NETHERCOTT MURDER.—We learn that Sheriff Colgrove, of Jones county, on Thursday night last, arrested a colored man named Patrick Artist, near Core Creek, on suspicion of being implicated in the murder of Col. Nethercott.

He strenuously insisted upon his innocence until yesterday morning, when he confessed to the Deputy Sheriff that he was the party who committed the murder. His story and his confession are in many respects very contradictory.

There can be but little doubt that Artist is one of the men who committed the foul deed, although persons of his story are not reliable. We are informed that there is considerable evidence to show that the man shot at Bachelors Creek four nights ago was one of Col. Nethercott's murderers, yet Artist does not implicate him.

MEMBER.—The quiet of our city was disturbed on Sunday morning by intelligence that a most atrocious murder had been committed in the western part of the city, near the railroad depot, by three negroes—two of them soldiers.—The particulars, as we learn them, are as follows: "On the morning of the 21st, it appears that Anderson Selby, the murdered man, formerly a slave of T. H. Selby, Esq., of this city, and recently a watchman in the employment of Briggs & Dodd, went to

the house of a negro woman, named Harriet Ann Hill, where he was refused admittance. It is said that jealousy and ill-blood existed between Selby and the other negroes implicated on account of the woman. Shortly after leaving, Selby was set upon by Alexander Willis, Anthony Jackson (negro soldiers) and Henderson Taylor, negro. The evidence on the subject was that Willis cut Selby in the region of the heart with a knife, several inches long, while Taylor struck him several blows on the head with a rock—both inflicting terrible wounds, either of which would have been fatal. Jackson was by, aiding and abetting.

The jury, summoned by J. B. Crawford, Esq., returned after a patient investigation of the facts, as disclosed by the evidence, rendered a verdict that "the deceased came to his death by blows inflicted by a knife and stones in the hands of Alexander Willis, Henderson Taylor, Anthony Jackson, and Henderson Taylor. These three negroes have been arrested and committed to jail.
