House of Representatives concurring, that all the committees appointed by either branch of this General Assembly be and the same are hereby ordered to cease all further investigation in said alleged frauds.

Mr. Stille moved to refer the matter to the Finance Committee. Mr. French opposed the whole matter and demanded the measure as a repudiation of the frauds, and moved to lay it on the table.

Mr. French moved to refer the matter to a special committee of seven (one from each Congressional District). Harris of Wake, col. opposed the reference at this stage. He wished the bill put upon its second reading. He was opposed to repudiation, but in view of the developments—unfortunate developments, he was sorry to say—in regard to railroad matters, he would vote for any measure looking to the relief of the tax-burdened people.

Mr. French again took the floor, and, in effect, made an argument against the bill. He favored a reference to the Finance Committee and opposed a reference to a special committee.

Mr. French moved to amend the bill by inserting the word "and" after the word "shall" in section 1, and the House rejected the motion by a vote of 27, yeas 51.

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
