Whitewash for Outbuildings.

The following receipt is timely and reliable: As we have often recommended, good whitewash, well applied to fences, sheds, rough siding, and the walls and ceilings of buildings, cellars, etc., has a highly sanitary influence, as well as being preservative in its effects. To be durable, whitewash should be prepared in the following manner: Take the very best stone lime, and slake it in a close tub, covered with a cloth to preserve the steam. Salt—as much as can be dissolved in the water used for slacking and reducing the lime—should be applied, and the whole mass carefully strained and thickened with a small quantity of sand the purer and finer the better. A few pounds of wheat flour mixed with paste may be added, and will give greater durability to the mass, especially when applied to the exterior surface of buildings. With pure lime, properly slacked and mixed with twice its weight of fine sand and sifted wood ashes, in equal proportions, almost any color may be made by the addition of pigments. Granite, slate, freestone and other shades may be imitated, and without any detriment to the durability of the wash. This covering is very often applied, and with good effect, to underpinning, stone fences, roofs and the walls of barns and other outbuildings. Probably the pure whitewash is more healthy than the colored, as its alkaline properties are superior, and when used in cellars, kitchens and sleeping apartments produces salutary results.

No person who regards the health of his family should fail to apply a coat of such whitewash every spring. Country places, especially farm out-houses, fences, etc., are greatly improved in appearance by annual coat, and it will add to their permanency much more than many would imagine. As we all know, it is cheap and easily applied, so that neither expense nor labor can be pleaded against it.

Reasoning Fence Posts.

I was taught that fence posts should be reasoned, but a trial of bar posts set green seemed to disprove it. Feeling encouraged in that direction, my brother about June 1, 1946, sawed from thrifty white oak trees posts for a fence in front of our house. They were 6x6 inches at butt, 3x3 inches at top, and were set at once, the fence being completed in July. The fence is now standing, and is in fair order, only two of the posts having been renewed in the thirty-six years.

I am moved to this communication by having observed on a visit to Lancaster county, Pa., a long line of posts and rail fence, with a second set of posts told off for its repairs, many of which new posts were half worn out, by exposure to the weather, between the time of cutting and dressing out. We have proved on this farm that chestnut posts are more durable if cut and peeled, and placed directly in position in the ground.

Recipes.

WEE PUDDING.—Quarter of a pound of flour, quarter of a pound of butter, quarter of a pound of sugar, two eggs, rind of a lemon; beat for twenty minutes; half fill teacups and bake for twenty minutes.

WESTERN COOKIES.—One cup sour milk, one cup of powdered sugar, a little salt, one teaspoonful of soda; mix as soft as possible; roll thin; sprinkle with sugar; slightly roll out and bake in a quick oven.

POULET A LA CREME.—This is a dainty dish for an invalid. Boil a chicken; chop or pound the flesh to a paste; rub it through a wire sieve; mix with a little cream and two or three eggs; season with pepper and salt; put in a mold; steam and serve hot.

OMLETTE MACARONI.—Beat whites and yolks of three eggs separately; put a small pinch of salt and two tablespoonfuls of milk or cream into the yolks, with a half teaspoonful of cold butter (cooked the day before), stir in the whites of the eggs (beaten stiff) the last thing, and cook quickly.

Double the quantities for a large omelet.

SALT MACKEREL.—and, indeed, any salt fish, may be eaten with impunity when properly cooked and served up with lemon. A fresh lemon, sliced and laid over a dish of properly cooked mackerel, emits an odor, when mingled with the fishy odor, that to most persons is absolutely agreeable, and in some persons even whets the appetite. If the juice of the lemon now be pressed out on the fish, the taste is very much improved.

SPICED BEEF.—Take the bones out of a six-pound salt flank of beef, and slit the meat into a long, thin piece; sprinkle with a pinch of each of the following spices, mixed together; pepper, allspice, mace, nutmeg, ginger, and a handful of chopped parsley; roll it up tightly and, and place in a cloth closely tied; put in a stewpan; add one small onion, one carrot, a piece of celery, and a small bunch of sweet herbs. Cover with water, let boil, simmer gently five hours; when cooked, tie the cloth up tighter and press between two boards; let it get cold. It is can be served either plain or glazed.

TOMATO SOUP without stock can be made at a moment's notice, and it is a great convenience sometimes to make soup in this way. This is very appetizing. Cook in one quart of water, till very tender, one quart can of tomatoes (or eight large sized ones), ten minutes will probably be long enough to let them boil; add one tea-spoonful of soda. When the foaming stops, and not before, add one quart of cold milk, season with pepper, and salt, and butter, and let it come to a boil. Roll a few crackers very fine, and add just before taking the soup from the fire; put a layer of white-crackers, buttered, on the bottom of the dish in which the soup is to be turned.

DELICIOUS fruit-candy is made from this receipt: Get one coconut, one and one-half pounds of granulated sugar; wet the sugar with the milk of the coconut; put it in a saucepan, let it heat slowly; then boil rapidly for five minutes; add the coconut, grated very fine, boil for ten minutes, stirring constantly. Try it on a cold plate, if it forms a firm paste when cold, take it from the fire. Pour part of it out on a large tin lined with buttered paper. To the remaining cream add one quarter of a pound of raisins (stems and chopped), half a pound of blanched almonds, one pint of pecans, half a cup of chopped walnuts. Beat all well together; then pour it into the other in the tin, and, when cold, cut in bars or squares.

TO CURE CORNS.—Apply, morning and evening, one drop of solution of perchloride of iron.
