

BRILLIANT BANQUET GIVEN HONOR OF MR. JUSTICE HARLAN

Greeted by Three Hundred Prominent Men at the New Willard Last Evening on Twenty-fifth Anniversary of His Elevation.

All Government Officers With Whom He Has Been Associated for the Past Quarter of a Century Either Present or Send Letters.

President Roosevelt Praises Career and Character of Guest, Who Is Deeply Affected While Responding—Other Speakers.

Amid a scene of beauty, surrounded by three hundred of the brightest and most prominent men of the whole nation, the silver anniversary of Mr. Justice Harlan as a member of the Supreme Court of the United States was celebrated last night at the New Willard.

President Roosevelt, laying aside important engagements, participated, and gave praise to the guest of honor.

Every officer of the Government with whom Mr. Justice Harlan has been associated for the past quarter of a century either appeared in person or sent a letter of regret.

The banquet was held in the main banquet room of the hotel. It was prettily decorated in green. The tables were banked with roses, chrysanthemums, palms, laurel, and smilax.

Three Sons Present.

Seated at the guest table and facing the tables at which sat the members of the bar, were the guests of honor, at the right of the seat reserved for the President, all the members of the Supreme Court, members of the Court of Appeals of the District of Columbia, and the speakers of the evening.

The Rev. Richard D. Harlan, D. D., said grace, after which the guests were served:

Shortly after 9:30, the President, with Dr. Needham, of Columbia University, entered the banquet room and took his seat at the guests' table.
