

SECRET SERVICE MAN TALKS OF HATFIELDS

Mr. Tyree Tells of Reform of One of Them

PARDONED FROM PRISON

Governor Atkinson Pardons Man He Personally Placed Under Arrest.

Frank H. Tyree, a member of the Secret Service Bureau, recently detailed by Chief Wilkie as one of the President's bodyguards, is a native of West Virginia and tells many interesting stories of the Little Mountain State.
