

VOTE OF 73 TO 5 FOR PANAMA CANAL TREATY

Long Discussion in Senate Over Agreement Comes to an End.

NOW WAITING ON COLOMBIA

Money to Be Paid When Foreign Congress Approves Compact—Appointments to Commission.

The Panama Canal treaty was last evening ratified by the Senate by a vote of 73 to 5. This action was non-partisan, though the opposition votes were all cast by Democrats—Senators Morgan and Pettus of Alabama, Mar. in and Daniel of Virginia, and Teller of Colorado.

Speculation is now rife as to the attitude of the Colombian congress, which must ratify the treaty in order to put it into operation. Dr. Herran, the Colombian charge d'affaires, has received advice from Bogota, announcing that the Colombian congress has been called to meet April 1. The officials say that by May 1 the treaty will be ratified.

Campaigning for Positions. Campaigning by friends of those seeking positions on the Canal Commission has been renewed in earnest, but it is generally understood that the President will give the matter no definite attention until he returns from his Western trip.

Immediately after the American minister at Bogota has informed the State Department that the treaty has been ratified, the \$40,000,000 due the New Panama Canal Company will be paid.

When the treaty was taken up in executive session of the Senate yesterday the money amendment, which provided for a disavowal of intention on the part of the United States of increasing its territory at the expense of any other republic, was discussed.

Twenty minutes were consumed in calling the roll and announcing pairs. As soon as the result was known the Senate adjourned until 11 o'clock today.

SCENTS STUMPING TOUR IN PRESIDENT'S TRIP

Mayor Harrison Says Chicago Will Not Be Told How to Vote.

CHICAGO, March 18.—The proposed visit of President Roosevelt to Chicago on April 2 seems to Mayor Harrison to be a Republican scheme to influence the city election. In fact, Mr. Harrison thinks the President's entire itinerary has been planned for effect on the elections in various cities.

"Should President Roosevelt come here on a political mission, or his visit turn into a political affair, I certainly will pay no more attention to his presence than to that of any Cabinet minister or similar person who might come to the city. Should he come simply as the President, and not make his visit a political one, he should be treated as the President by Democrats as well as by Republicans."

BAD WEATHER BROUGHT INCREASE OF DEATHS

Mortality During the Past Week in the District.

Deaths in the number of 151 occurred in the District for the week ended on Saturday last. This represented a death rate of 28.3 per thousand of population. Of the deceased 97 were white, death rate being 24.9, and 54 colored, death rate 39.9.

There were 12 fatal cases of grip, 2 of typhoid fever, 3 of whooping cough, and 6 of measles. By violence 3 deaths were reported; 2 being cases of suicide, 1 of which was by "gunshot in the brain," and the other by opium poison.

There were 82 cases of typhoid fever brought over from the previous week. New cases numbering 11 were reported and 11 were discharged, leaving 82 cases still under medical care at the close of Saturday last.

In the same time 5 cases of diphtheria were in quarantine. During the week 4 new cases developed and 4 were discharged, leaving 5 cases remaining in isolation in 5 premises.

SALE OF LIQUOR AT G. A. R. HEADQUARTERS

GERMAN PRESS COMMENT ON CZAR'S MANIFESTO

"Kreuz Zeitung" Declares Proclamation Extremely Reactionary.

BERLIN, March 18.—Several of the leading German papers today make adverse comment on the Czar's recent manifesto, which has been in many quarters acclaimed as the greatest step in advance Russia has made since the edict abolishing serfdom in the Czar's domain.

The "Vorwarts" declares that the text of the manifesto has been falsely translated in the telegraphic reports circulated outside of the Russian empire. The Conservative paper, "Kreuz Zeitung," analyzing the manifesto, comes to the same conclusion, and announces that no step has been taken toward a constitutional government. It marks but the strengthening of absolutism, the paper says, and gives no religious toleration, but instead extends the priestly power. The manifesto, according to the paper, is not progressive, but extremely reactionary.

MAY RAISE QUARANTINE IN NEW HAMPSHIRE

Foot-and-Mouth Disease Practically Eliminated.

The United States Bureau of Animal Industry has been waging relentless war on the foot-and-mouth disease among the cattle of New Hampshire in the past week.

Three fine herds have been killed and their stables thoroughly disinfected by the Government inspectors. Seven herds have been wiped out recently. At present there are no cases of the disease known, but the inspectors are not relaxing their vigilance.

So thorough has been the work of the inspectors that the people of the State are anticipating an early removal of the quarantine against their cattle, but have not yet received any positive assurances.

HAD A SECRET TO TELL PRESIDENT ROOSEVELT

Peter Bauer Walked From Wyoming and Landed at St. Elizabeth's.

An air of excitement pervaded the Capitol for a few moments yesterday, when a burly German, wild-eyed and fierce looking, sauntered down the corridor swinging a huge club. He was stopped by Policeman Theodore Spencer, who demanded to know his mission.

"I want to see the President," the man replied. "The President's right busy just now," Spencer said, and then asked, "Can I help you out?"

"No, I must see him myself. No one else will do. I have a great secret to tell him, which must never get beyond his ears."

Spencer realized he was dealing with an insane person, and succeeded in turning the man to the Sixth precinct station. Here the prisoner said his name was Peter Bauer, of Buffalo, Wyo.; his age thirty-three, and his business that of sheepherder.

Bauer told the police he had walked all the way from Wyoming to Washington for the sole purpose of having an interview with the President. It had required a year's time to make the trip, he declared. He refused to divulge the secret which he desired to make known to President Roosevelt.

Acting Sanitary Officer Hoover was informed of the arrest. He ordered that an examination of the man's mental condition be made. This was done by Police Surgeons Frank Vale and Charles Marbury, who pronounced him insane. He was later removed to the St. Elizabeth's Hospital for temporary detention. His relatives will be communicated with.

SEPTIC SEWAGE TANKS SUCCEED IN VANCOUVER

Consul L. Edwin Dudley, of Vancouver, in a letter to the State Department, says that the three septic tanks for the disposal of sewage which have been in operation in that city for several years have proved so satisfactory that the local authorities have decided to erect three additional tanks next summer. The plan will then be able to handle nearly all the sewage of the city.

MORGAN AFTER TIN MINES. CALCUTTA, March 18.—A telegram from Bangkok reports that an agent of J. P. Morgan is bidding for the concession of the entire tin mining industry of Siamese Malaya. In 1887 the late Mr. Morgan's agent made a similar offer, but it was rejected.

BOOMERANG THROWING SHOWN ON WHITE LOT

G. T. Walker Sprains His Knee in Displaying His Skill.

G. T. Walker, a prominent English scientist, who was for many years connected with the department of applied mathematics of Cambridge University, and is now in Washington studying the methods of the Weather Bureau, gave an exhibition of boomerang throwing in the White Lot the other afternoon which attracted the attention of many local scientists, particularly those who are interested in solving the problem of aerial navigation.

The boomerang used by Mr. Walker is of wood and in the shape of a letter L. Its sides are thirty inches long and two and one-half inches wide, and it weighs eight ounces. It is flat on one side and rounded on the other.

Mr. Walker threw this boomerang vertically for a distance of fifty yards. The weapon darted high into the air, returned far above his head and dropped at his feet.

Several scientists who witnessed the exhibition attempted to duplicate Mr. Walker's feat, but without success. When he threw the boomerang it seemed to have a strange rotary velocity which none of the other scientists could impart.

In throwing the instrument Mr. Walker sprained his knee, and his injury was so painful that he was compelled to cancel an engagement he had to lecture before the Philosophical Society of Washington at the Cosmos Club Saturday evening. Mr. Walker is living at the Cosmos Club. In this city, he will leave here Saturday to go to India, where he is to be connected with the Weather Bureau.
