Frank Reinhardt Wins From the Former Champion.

NEW YORK, May 1.—History repeated itself when Golfer Walter J. Travis went down to defeat today at the hands of Frank Reinhardt, the young Princeton crack.

The downfall of the former champion occurred in the first match play round of the annual invitation tournament over the Garden City links, the youngster winning by 3 up and 2 to play.

Reinhardt's play going out was decidedly brilliant, going to the turn in 38, and having the veteran two down. He made the home journey in 43, giving him 81 for the round, as against 83 for Travis.

The latter won the low score medal in the morning qualifying round, with a capital 77, Reinhardt making an 82.
