BURGLAR AND WATCHMAN FIGHT TO THE DEATH

Soloito Used With Fatal Effect at New Rochelle

NEW YORK, June 20.—A desperate encounter between Morris O'Hearne, a private watchman, and an Italian burglar occurred in the aristocratic section of New Rochelle early this morning.

The encounter occurred about 1:30 o'clock in Manhattan Avenue, near Davenport's Neck, where the Hoyts, Kanes, Isells, and other millionaire yachtsmen have their summer homes.

Suddenly O'Hearne jumped from the shadow and challenged the man, demanding to know what the sack contained. The marauder, an Italian, replied that it was none of his business.

O'Hearne grabbed the man, and the two went rolling over and over on the sidewalk, the watchman wielding his night stick and the Italian stabbing with a stiletto.

The dentist rushed out, but before he reached the watchman two shots rang out, and the watchman fell dead to the walk. The Italian took to his heels, and has not yet been captured.


