

Reactionary Tendency in Stock Market Follows Publication of Bank Statement

NEW WEAKNESS FOUND IN THE PENNSY STOCKS

Decline a Point After Publication of Bank Statement—Other Securities Close Reactionary.

NEW YORK, Nov. 14.—The stock market this morning was narrow and professional. The covering movement of yesterday appeared to have temporarily spent its force, and some unfavorable effect was produced by total lack of response in London to the rally here.

Pennsylvania sagged off 1/4 per cent, but later ruled steady. Chicago and Alton advanced a point for preferred and 2 per cent for common on a revival of rumors of the acquisition of property by some connecting system. In industrials, United States Steel continued strong. Amalgamated Copper was merely steady.

The market yielded after the favorable bank statement under renewed pressure against Pennsylvania, which declined 1 per cent. The rest of the market closed at fractional reactions.

The market opened rather quietly and slightly lower, but there was no heavy pressure on any one stock. Pennsylvania and Copper lost 3/4, but these represented the limits of fluctuations. Steel Es sold up 1/4. Steel common and preferred opened unchanged on fairly big dealings.

BUTTE COPPER WAR NOT YET ADJUSTED

Local Investors Receive Denial of Rumored Settlement.

Washington investors in the Amalgamated Copper Company received a private dispatch today announcing that the Amalgamated had reached no adjustment with the copper interest of P. A. Heinze. This announcement is based on information obtained from an authoritative source, and will put at rest the rumors that peace had been declared.

The bank statement was conceded to be better than had been expected. The loss of \$14,339,000 deposits was the only disappointing feature, considering current conditions.

Prominent capitalists have agreed to furnish to the Seaboard Air-Line Company the money sufficient to complete the Birmingham extension of the road and otherwise to furnish the company with all the funds that it needs for any and all purposes.

Assuming that dividends at the rate of 6 per cent will be maintained on Pennsylvania stock, the investment yield on purchases made at the current level is over 5 per cent, a rate that doubtless will appeal to many people who have money available for investment.

Predictions were made on the floor of the exchange today that Pennsylvania, St. Paul, Rock Island, and Union Pacific stocks would decline 10 points because of advancing 5. This theory is based on the strength of the manipulators now in control of the market.
