HUNGARY WANTS NO MORMONISM

Expels Two Latter Day Saints Who Had Organized a Colony.

VIENNA, Oct. 15.—The Hungarian government has taken a firm stand against the introduction of Mormonism. Two young Americans, Pingree and Wetzel, who recently arrived in Temesvar and founded a Mormon colony, have been expelled from the city after legal proceedings involving the liberty of religious profession. The appeal to the minister of the interior was returned yesterday with an adverse decision, and the two Mormons will have to leave the city within forty-eight hours.
