LIBAU WORKMEN GO OUT ON STRIKE

ST. PETERSBURG, Jan. 25.—The strike today extended to Libau, where are situated the shipyards where the third and fourth Baltic squadrons are being prepared for dispatch to the Far East.

MOSCOW TROOPS KILL FOURTEEN

MOSCOW, Jan. 25.—The theaters were kept open yesterday evening as though natural conditions prevailed. The audiences, however, were small.

The streets were quiet in the early morning. Patrols of troops were located everywhere.

All the newspapers, with the exception of three, appeared this morning.

The struggle began through the attempts of strikers to assemble in the Red Square.

The Cossacks attacked them with whips and then with swords.

Some of the strikers possessed revolvers and began firing on the troops, who thereupon replied.

The strikers then retreated.

The Kremlin, in the heart of the city, has been equipped as a fortress, and has been supplied with artillery and troops under the direct guidance of the governor general, who has made his headquarters there.

Other Works Closed.

The strike has spread to the employes of the Habnse Works, the Goupon Metal Works, the Gorshonoff brewery, and the firms of Liszt and Maller.

The manufacturers have held a meeting and passed a resolution to telegraph to Minister of the Interior Prince Minsk, and to request that the strikers be until they begin to revolt in some manner.

The university corporation has postponed its banquet until the trouble is over.

Shops Not Plundered.

Reports that a mob plundered and wrecked shops in the Tverskaja are untrue.

There was complete tranquility yesterday within the boundaries of the city, but the people are keeping indoors, owing to the official warnings.

The larger industrial concerns are being guarded in order to prevent the men employed there from being intimidated, but it is the belief that the strike will become general.

There are no troops in sight in the city proper. The citizens are alarmed at the prospect of an eruption of hundreds of thousands of workmen, and demand the proclamation of a state of siege.

Small Garrison.

The Moscow garrison is no more than 20,000, but the authorities consider that this is sufficient for present needs, and evidently are determined to avoid bloodshed if possible.

They declare they have the situation well in hand.

Carstain Grobe, the Russian consul, has called upon M. Roudneff, the assistant police master, who is acting in the absence of Chief Volkoff, and requested an explanation of the posted telegram from London alleging that the disturbances at the Russian dockyards and arsenals were due to Anglo-Japanese instigation; that both Great Britain and Japan are spending vast sums of money to prevent the Russian second Pacific squadron from reaching the Far East, and adding that "all Russians who strike are therefore in connivance with the enemy."

Assumes Responsibility.

M. Roudneff produced the original telegram in evidence of good faith. Captain Grobe stated that he would report the matter to the embassy at St. Petersburg, as he considered that the posting of the alleged telegram imperiled the lives of subjects of Great Britain who are employed in factories here.

M. Roudneff assured him that there was absolutely no cause for apprehension, but assumed the responsibility for the publication. M. Roudneff also offered Captain Grobe personal satisfaction in a resort to arms.

General Trepoft's appointment to the governor generalship of St. Petersburg was a complete surprise here. It is rumored that Minister of the Interior Sviatopolk-Mirski may be appointed governor general of Moscow.

Tverskaja thoroughfare is almost empty and the sidewalks are down to the governor general's palace. Grand Duke Sergius, the former governor general, is said to have taken refuge in the palace of the Kremlin.

An air of suppressed excitement prevails everywhere.

The town is full of rumors, among which is one to the effect that the strikers intend marching to the Neskoutchaya place, outside of Moscow, where Grand Duke Sergius formerly resided.

Twenty thousand men out at Riga.

RIGA, Russia, Jan. 25.—The police have unearthed a quantity of revolutionary proclamations which were being distributed despite the efforts of the police to prevent such literature getting around among the strikers.

There are now 20,000 men out. The troops are guarding the factories, but all is quiet this morning.

Yesterday evening the strike movement spread, involving the water works and the electric light station. The

striker organized a parade and marched through the streets singing revolutionary songs.

There were several collisions between the workmen and strikers, and though several pistol shots were fired no fatalities are reported.

Despite the fact that quiet prevailed this morning, the inhabitants of the town are alarmed, and the majority of them are keeping indoors.

STRIKE AT VILNA NOT GENERAL

VILNA, Russia, Jan. 25.—The strike continues this morning, but has not yet become general.

The biggest factories are still shut down, and some of those which had resumed work yesterday.

TROOPS FIRE ON KOLPINO STRIKERS

LONDON, Jan. 25.—The St. Petersburg correspondent of the "Star" reports a clash between troops and enraged strikers from Kolpino, not far from St. Petersburg.

The Emperor's Horse Guards, he says, were riding along the Nevsky Prospekt toward Peaky on Wednesday night, and when two miles away met the Kolpino strikers.

The extent of the clash is not given.

STRIKERS' PLIGHT GROWS SERIOUS

ST. PETERSBURG, Jan. 25.—The plight of the strikers is rapidly growing more serious, owing to the falling funds.

"Thousands are almost at the point of starvation. Provisions are scarce, and such as are obtainable are selling at a price too high to be purchased by the poorer classes.

The strikers' organization is doing its best to help the men, but their aid is not sufficient. The organization is giving the men 25 cents a day, and 10 cents extra for each member of the family.

This money is being subscribed by citizens of the capital, but not in sufficient amount to keep the strike going much longer. The organization needs at least \$25,000 daily, and has not much more than half that amount.

A plan is on foot today among the workers' committees to cut down the money grants and buy provisions by the wholesale for distribution according to the size of the family to be supplied.

It is learned this morning that a number of the strikers are in favor of accepting the opportunity of returning to work afforded them by the proclamation issued last night, which, in effect, promised to grant them a majority of the economical demands. This number is growing.

At a number of conferences held yesterday evening, however, the majority of the strikers decided not to surrender till their last crumb was gone and there was no alternative to surrender but starvation for their loved ones.

The employers will meet today and discuss the advisability of conceding the demands of the strikers.

The masters are fast losing money, and they fear ruin if the strike continues. It is estimated \$200 in profits have been lost by the employers since the strike was originated.

POLICE CONCEAL BODIES OF DEAD

ST. PETERSBURG, Jan. 25.—It is stated this morning that a number of bodies of those who fell victims to the bullets of the troops on Sunday last are lying in the People's Palace.

This latter place has been converted into a temporary morgue, to which the public has been refused admission.

As a result, a number of families are unable to ascertain whether relatives, who are missing, are dead, have been arrested, or have been exiled.

STUDENTS DIE FOR TREACHERY

ST. PETERSBURG, Jan. 25.—Seven students who have hitherto been the

leaders of the revolutionary movement in the Basil Island district, have been put to death by strikers.

The strikers became suspicious that the students were acting treacherously.

They called a meeting, at which the students were promptly sentenced to death, and were strangled in a secret subterranean meeting place. Later it transpired that the students were innocent of treachery.

TO ASK RELEASE FOR PRISONERS

ST. PETERSBURG, Jan. 25.—It is learned that Prince Mirski, the minister of the interior, has promised to use his influence to secure the release of a number of the moderates who were recently arrested by orders of General Trepoft, because of their avowed sympathy with the strike movement.

These arrests have been much greater in number than has been generally known.

Peter and Paul fortress, where many of the prisoners taken into custody have lodged, is so crowded that it is necessary to lodge three prisoners in each cell, giving them just enough space to sleep side by side.

SEEK TO LEARN EXILES' PLANS

LONDON, Jan. 25.—It is reported a number of Russian secret service police have reached London for the purpose of ferreting out the plans and movements of the revolutionary committees here.

The Russian government, it is said, fears the committees are composed of exiled Russians, Poles, and Finns who, on account of their knowledge of the country and affairs in the czar's dominions, may be able to engineer united action in behalf of the revolutionary movement in Russia.

RIOTERS ASSAIL CZAR'S EMBASSY

BREST, France, Jan. 25.—Serious disorders followed a revolutionary meeting here last night. Anarchists attacked the Russian consulate with stones, crying:

"Death to Nicholas! Death to the murderer!"
