DRAW ATTENTION

First Publicly Displayed at Corcoran.
FAMOUS ARTISTS EXHIBIT
Salon of Illustration at Local Gallery
Includes Work of Best in Striking Show.

At the art exhibit in the Corcoran gallery, under the auspices of Collier's Weekly, which opened this morning, were shown for the first time in this city, three large portrait canvases done in oil by Charles Dana Gibson.

The works are merely entitled "Studies in Oil," and are of two young women hung on either side of a striking portrait of an old man. There was no indication of the black and white artist except his boldness of stroke.

Remingtons.

Paintings of trapper, cowboy, and Indian life by Frederic Remington, occupy a conspicuous position in the gallery. They include such well-known views as "The Stampede," Indians frightening the pasturing horses of the white immigrants to their plains; "The Unknown Explorers," "The Fight for the Water Hole," and the "Gathering of the Trappers." Here are snow and night scenes—"The End of the Day," a cabin settlement with horses home from work in snowy weather, and "An Early Start for Market," a pack train of burros starting under start black skies.

The decorative covers of Maxwell Parish are shown, also covers and posters by Edward Penfield, and work by Howard Pyle, to whom so many of the men and women who exhibit at the show are beholden for a certain style in their work.

"The Nation's Makers" is exceedingly popular. Others by Pyle are "The Burning Ship," "The Minute Man," and an illustration for the story "Poisoned Ice." A. B. Frost, with hunting and scenes of the colored race, life on the farm and excellent unshaded pen-and-ink sketches of bucolic characters; Appleton Clark, with many illustrations of open air scenes from novels; Henry Reuter, with slashing views of combat between ironclads and torpedo boats and pictures of Russian, French, British and American navies; E. W. Kemble, with caricatures and comic cartoons; William J. Smedley and Karl Knipfing, with characteristic interiors and groups—these and many other favorites of the illustrated press are themselves copiously illustrated by their compositions.

For Sherlock Holmes.
The Sherlock Holmes series, by Frederic Dorr Steele, include "Adventure of the Priory School," "Adventure of the Three Students," "Adventure of Abbey Grange," and the "Adventure of the Empty House."

"Admiral Evans on the United States Ship Maine," by Henry Reuter, is popular at the exhibition, as is also the series for F. Marion Crawford's book, "For the Blood is the Life," by Walter Appleton Clark.
The odd work of Will Bradley is well exemplified in his illustration of the novel, "Castle Perilous." Near this group is found a realistic study by Frost, "Say, Mister, What Time Is It by Your Watch?" The study represents two tramps in a city holding up a city dandy in the country.

EUROPEAN CHAMPION
BREAKS RINK RECORD

Albert Cookson, Roller Skater, Is Too Fast for Americans—Trying to Arrange Match.

PHILADELPHIA, Dec. 14.—Albert Cookson, the English roller skating champion, broke the record for one mile at the Coliseum rink Monday night, for that house.
He did the mile in 2:47.5, which is considered good, inasmuch as the floor requires thirteen laps to the mile. Cookson came here hoping to get on a match with some of the crack skaters, but so far his efforts have failed, no one seeming to care to buck up against the speedy man. So he has been doing some speeding for the exercise and to keep in proper condition, as he is to meet some so-called champions in the West in the near future.
Cookson will leave Philadelphia tomorrow, accompanied by Joe Goodman, his manager, while in this country, for St. Louis, where he is to meet some of the fastest skaters in the world's championship race.
Tonight at the Coliseum he will try to make a new record for one, two, and five miles, unless some ambitious "speedy boy" of local fame consents to try conclusions with the Englishman. On Friday and Saturday evening Eddie McDowell will appear in trick and fancy skating feats.
