The fourth expeditionary battalion, which is being assembled at League Island and Boston, will consist of 500 men. They will be accompanied by two captains, Capt. Theodore H. Low and Capt. H. H. Hays.

THE FIFTH BATTALION

The fifth expeditionary battalion will consist of 415 men and will leave from various ports on Saturday. Some will go from Norfolk on the Texas and others by merchant steamers from Miami, New Orleans, and Key West.

Stations Drawn Upon. The stations from which the men have been collected with the number drafted are as follows: For the fourth expeditionary battalion: From Annapolis, 24; from the Hartford, 28; from Boston, 30; from the Washburn, 1; from New York, 25; from Hancock, 62; from League Island, 36; from the Lancaster, 5; from Newport, 50; from Portsmouth, 10.

For the fifth expeditionary battalion: From New York, 1; from Norfolk, 49; from the Franklin, 1; from the navy yard, D. C., 29; from the Marine Barracks, D. C., 91; from Charleston, 35; from Fort Mifflin, 1; from Key West, 30; from New Orleans, 1; from Pensacola, 40; from San Juan, 35; and from Culebra, 54.

Although there will shortly be a force of 2,500 marines on duty in Cuba within a short time, counting those already there, there are 25 in the Marine Barracks, 100 on the Columbia, 200 on the Dixie, 400 on the Tacoma and Newark and 500 on the Kentucky and Indiana.




