The Jamestown Exposition is Directly Adjoining PINE BEACH

PINE BEACH is to the South what Coney Island is to the North—an amusement resort of wondrous proportions, teeming with modern attractions costing hundreds of thousands of dollars, representing all that's new, novel, and worthy in the world of amusement. PINE BEACH is situated on the shores of historic Hampton Roads, Virginia, bounded on the North and East by the grounds of the Jamestown Exposition.

The famous naval encounter of the Civil War—the battle between the "Merrimac" and "Monitor"—took place on Hampton Roads, directly in front of Pine Beach, within a stone's throw of our boardwalk.

The cities of Norfolk and Portsmouth are but a twenty-minute ride, by rail or water, from Pine Beach, while directly opposite our grounds, on the western shore of Hampton Roads, lies Newport News, where is located the greatest ship-building plant of the country. Hampton, the oldest continuous settlement of Englishmen in America, is but a ten-minute ride by trolley distant from Newport News. Another ten-minute trolley ride and you arrive at Fort Monroe, originally a palisaded fort of the first settlers, planned in 1614 and fortified a few years later. It is now the finest fort in America and the chief artillery station of the United States Government.

In brief, a person standing on our boardwalk, has before him a panoramic view of Hampton Roads, Newport News, Hampton, and Old Point Comfort (Fort Monroe), a sight in itself worth traveling many miles to behold.

**TO GET THE BEST VIEW OF THE WAR
SHIPS YOU MUST BE AT PINE BEACH**

BEGINNING April 26th and continuing up to November 30th, 1907, the warships of the world's navies will be assembled on Hampton Roads—the chief feature of the Jamestown Exposition. At no spot along the entire water front is there a view point to compare with our mammoth boardwalk, affording, as it does, a clear, unobstructed sweep of the entire harbor from Lambert's Point to Fort Monroe, a distance of at least fifteen miles. The great warships will ride at anchor almost within arm's reach. The officers and men aboard the vessels can be plainly seen with the naked eye—no marine glasses necessary! And at no other point along the entire shore is this possible! This is a FACT that one visit to PINE BEACH will prove to your entire satisfaction.

If you go by WATER—get off at PINE BEACH pier!

If you go by RAIL—get off at PINE BEACH, right on the grounds!
