

ROOF COLLAPSES AT NEW GAITY, TWO MEN WURT

Debris Falls Through Two Floors Carrying Workmen With It.

Weakened by the constant pounding of workmen packing concrete, a small part of the roof of the new Gaity Theater, on Ninth street northwest, between E and F streets, fell in shortly after 11 o'clock this morning, and the weight of the bricks, concrete and beams, striking the third and second floor, carried them through to the ground. Abe Lincoln, colored, 1067 Seventh street southeast, and William Thomas, colored, 419 L street northwest, were carried with the roof to the ground floor. They are at the Emergency Hospital.

WIFE HIS JAILER, BUT MEYER CALLS ON OTHER WOMAN

CYCLONE KILLS 4 AND DEVASTATES ILLINOIS VILLAGE

Scores Are Injured and Further Fatalities Are Expected to Result.

NASHVILLE, Ill., June 8.—A cyclone passed over New Minden, seven miles north of this city, last night and resulted in the death of four people, and the fatal injury of several others. The dead:

MRS. HENRY WEIH and two children. A young child of Carl Stuhmeyer. Fatally injured: Henry Weih. Seriously injured: Herman Weih, left arm and leg broken and internally injured. Probably fatally injured: Mrs. Carl Stuhmeyer, back injured. Ten-year-old child of Henry Heesman, abdominal injuries.

A score of other people were bruised about the head and body through falling debris. The storm struck the northern portion of the town and most of the houses destroyed were country cottages. In the town, the German Lutheran Church was severely damaged, the steeple being blown down and the roof torn off. The bell in the belfry was hurled through a large pipe organ below, almost demolishing it.

On the north side of the church the parochial school was blown to splinters, while the parochial school on the south side of the edifice was unharmed. These buildings were the first in the path of the storm and were practically the only ones in the village properly that were damaged. From this point the cyclone continued on and leveled about seven more farm houses.

The Weih house, in which the four people were killed, was about the last house struck by the cyclone. It was completely demolished. The occupants attempted to reach the cellar, but the approach of the storm was so sudden that they were unable to do so. They were carried with the debris of the house, and hurled about the fields adjoining their homes.

A report also reached here that a farmer driving from Hoytston to New Minden with a farm wagon and binder had disappeared, and no word or trace had been received from him. It is believed he was caught in the path of the storm and carried to his death.

LAWYERS SIDESTEP FEUDIST'S DEFENSE IN KENTUCKY CASE

LEXINGTON, Ky., June 8.—John Collins is on trial at the exposition, Jamestown, for the attempted assassination of Ben Martin. Collins has no money to employ counsel and several attorneys were requested by Circuit Judge Young to act, but refused as they feared being mixed up in the old Tolliver-Martin feud, which is the point of breaking out as a result of the attempted assassination of Martin.

Collins and Martin were enemies during the Rowan county war of the 80's and Collins has, it is alleged, attempted several times recently to murder Martin. Bloodhounds trailed him after the last attempt, resulting in his arrest. Many of the Martin and Tolliver factions are removing to Rowan county and are reported ready for trouble.


MILITARY OF GIRL TAKES HIS LIFE

SAN ANTONIO, Tex., June 8.—Lieut. Mack Richardson, whose resignation as first lieutenant in the Twenty-sixth Infantry was accepted by President Roosevelt, took a dose of morphine and prussic acid. He was found in his room and removed to the Emergency Hospital at Fort Sam Houston, where he died. He left a note, which read:

"To whom it may concern: This act has been inevitable since last November. Lieutenant Richardson was to have married the daughter of Major Kelly, who was stationed with the Twenty-fifth Infantry at Brownsville. On the day set for the wedding he did not appear, writing that he was ill. The wedding was fixed for a second time, but he missed one train and arrived three hours late. When he did not appear at the hour set for the wedding Miss Kelly left for Washington.

Richardson was a morphine fiend. There has been a revulsion of feeling in his favor, and one of the officers, who had messed with him since he left West Point, says that "Richardson came very near being a hero."

TRUNK FALLS 60 FEET AND KILLS LITTLE GIRL

NEW YORK, June 8.—A remarkable accident happened on the south roadway within several hundred yards of the New York approach to the Brooklyn bridge. An express wagon, upon which trunks were piled very high, swerved against the railing with such force that a trunk weighing several hundred pounds slipped off and fell sixty feet to the ground at Vanderwater street, landing on eleven-year-old Felomena Bruno, of 260 Front street. The child was instantly killed.

MADE NINETY BARRELS DURING SINGLE WEEK

OWENSBORO, Ky., June 8.—Owensboro has a champion of the world. He is a champion whisky barrel maker and holds the world's record in making barrels. This honor belongs to Harry Merrell, who is employed at George W. Stout & Sons' cooper shop in the west-end. His previous record for one week was seventy-six barrels. The average barrel maker completes about twenty barrels a week. They are paid 40 cents a barrel and Merrell earned \$36 last week.
