


CARNEGIE INSTITUTION ADDS BUILDING IN MISSION STYLE TO CLEVELAND PARK SECTION

The exaggerated pompadour and the waving of the hair in set waves has had its day, and instead the hair is arranged about the temples in a natural way—little wavy locks and soft fluffy fullness suggestive of a portrait of Reynolds.

The hair is a setting for the face, and it can either enhance or spoil the expression; like the frame of a picture, it makes or mars. Well dressed hair gives the features delicacy of expression and suggests refinement.

Every woman should know how to arrange her hair so that it may accentuate her good features and hide her defects. A tasteful, becoming and harmonious coiffure makes the woman in middle life look at least ten years younger, and transforms the plain girl into a beauty.

A woman should be able without the aid of a hair dresser to choose a particular coiffure best adapted to her face. Long faces and long necks require that the hair should be fluffed out on either side and dressed low, so that it gives breadth.

First shampoo the hair, and before it is quite dry use an iron that is not hot, just warm enough to give the hair a carelessly natural wave. Curl all around the face if the hair is very long and heavy. If it is short and thin go entirely over the hair in irregular ripples, then it can be arranged successfully high or low.
