PITTSBURG, Pa., July 6.—Wholesale information will probably be laid today against the persons who indulged in lawn tennis yesterday. Director of Public Safety Lang sent out notifications to all persons who are in the habit of playing tennis on Sunday informing them that the practice must cease. This, in spite of the fact that most of the courts are on private property. There was great indignation when the order went forth, and almost in every instance the order was defied. Scores of people who have tennis courts on their own property believe, like President Roosevelt, that there is no harm in a game after they have attended to their religious duties. Director Lang thinks otherwise and says the games must stop.
