

FLOWER DISPLAY WILL BE GORGEOUS

Society Interested in Annual Show to Be Held November 12.

Society this year will put the finishing touch of beauty to the annual flower show at the old Masonic Temple, to be given by the Florists' Club November 12 to 15. Features prepared by the professionals will include all previous efforts. Rare flowers will be brought from the Government greenhouses and lavish splendor will characterize the decorations of the Washington exhibitors. As a centerpiece a gorgeous fountain of American Beauty roses, made of over 1,000 flowers and replaced every day with fresh flowers, will give the keynote of the show. Members of the Florists' Club will each have sections where their individuality will be given free play with the other exhibits. Private gardens of Washington will contribute largely to the show. Their exhibits may not vie in pretentiousness with the professionals, but it is said that some society women have excellent specimens to show. Last year the Washington flower show outside that of Madison Square Garden and it is planned by the members to make this year's display the best the country has yet seen. To do this, great expense has been incurred and plans have been considered for many weeks. George Cook, superintendent of the Florists, who for many years had charge of the decorations at inaugural balls, has been placed in general charge of the plans. All designs will have his approval in order to make the show, as a whole, finished and harmonious. President Kramer has appointed the following chairman of committees: W. F. Gude, finance; John Robertson, awards; Elmer Mayberry, entertainment; D. Z. Blackstone, reception; George Cook, superintendent exhibits; George C. Schaffer, secretary.

SEEKING A REMEDY FOR CROWDED CARS

Interstate Commerce Commission Puts Four Inspectors to Work Here.

Four inspectors from the Interstate Commerce Commission will be detailed to assist in investigating the overcrowding of street cars in the District of Columbia. The inspectors will work with Secretary H. Clifford Eddy, of the District Electric Railway Commission, which has the movement in charge. At a meeting of the commission yesterday afternoon, it was announced that sufficient data had not been obtained yet to effect a regulation governing the number of persons to be allowed in street cars. The subject was discussed for more than two hours, but no definite action was determined upon. It is believed that some conclusion will be reached by next Wednesday, at which time a regulation is expected to be framed and forwarded to the Interstate Commerce Commission. Letters were read showing what methods are being used in London, Paris, and Berlin to counteract the evil of overcrowded cars, and it is likely that some such measures may be adopted by the commission. Secretary Eddy will submit to the commission a report on his recent trip to Pittsburgh when he attended a series of tender tests. He will include in his report an explanation of the pay-as-you-enter and pay-within plans. Mr. Eddy explained that in some of the cars used in Pittsburgh, the steps are operated by the motorman and conductor, and when the car is in motion the steps are folded up close to the car so that no one can get on or off. Complaints were submitted to the commission and many recommendations were also made, all of which will be attended to by the board at an early date.
