

# JOHNSON EAGER TO KNOW ATTITUDE OF NEBRASKAN

## Governor Would Like to Have Bryan Declare Himself.

### HAS DECIDED VIEWS ON FUTURE OF PARTY

### Exults in Victory in State Against the Steel Trust.

ST. PAUL, Nov. 12.—John A. Johnson, plain Democrat, thrice elected governor in Republican Minnesota, has some very decided views on the future of the Democratic party nationally, and also upon the causes that resulted in such a rout for the national ticket in the Presidential campaign of 1908.

While Governor Johnson did not say so, from the trend of his conversation it was easy to see that he would like to see William Jennings Bryan declare himself on two points, namely:

His excuses for his third defeat, and his position in the future as regards his leadership of the party.

If Bryan, in the face of his third defeat, is to attempt to hold himself in the position of dictator of the party and of its policies, then John A. Johnson will attend strictly to his own knitting in Minnesota, and, from what he says, he will find plenty to engage his attention in the next two years and will let the "Sage of Fairview" continue his rule.

### Two Elements.

"I think hundreds of thousands of Democrats representing what might be called both elements of the party—I do not like the word faction—would be very glad to hear from Mr. Bryan at this time," is the guarded way in which Johnson puts it.

"It is too soon after election," he said, "to talk freely. If, within the next few months, I should be convinced that there was any desire on the part of the rank and file of the Democracy for an expression of my views on national questions, then I would gladly give them."

"And if I do speak," added the governor, "I will speak plainly and to the point. There will be no chance for any one to misunderstand me."

duly over his phenomenal victory in Minnesota.

"We won, and won decisively," he says, "and in winning we gave the Steel trust and the other great corporations that were lined up against us in the fight one of the worst lickings that they ever had, and one that I believe they will remember for some years to come."

### Slow to Talk.

Many attempts have been made since the ballots were counted the country over, a little more than a week ago, to get an expression of opinion from Johnson. It has been pointed out to him that in many quarters he is looked upon as the Moses who will be called upon to lead the Democratic party out of the wilderness of defeat and despondency; that he is looked upon by many as the logical leader of the party, in view of Bryan's overwhelming defeat, and that he owes it to himself and the party to speak now.

To all of these importunities Governor Johnson has been mute. He explains by saying:

"The storm has not yet cleared away. There is a murkiness in the Democratic sky; the water, agitated by the storm, is still rolled. There is a feeling of exultation in some quarters, of sadness in others. Time is a great healer and will heal these sore spots, just as a little sunshine will brighten the sky and clear the muddy water."

"In view of the fact that my name was voted for in the Democratic convention in Denver as a candidate for the Presidency, I consider that it would be indelicate for me to give any expression of opinion as to the causes that contributed to the defeat of the Democracy in the country at large, or what must be done to remedy conditions if the party is to make itself a force that will be felt and seriously considered in campaigns to come."
