

SERBIAN ROYALTY PREPARES TO FLEE

Crushed By National Defeat In Outcome of Latest Balkan Affair.

Formula presented by Sir Edward Grey, secretary of state for foreign affairs. This formula, while ostensibly being prepared by England, and offered by her as an intermediary, is in reality nothing more than Austria's unmodified demand.

It is hard to see where any powers except Austria and Germany get any credit or prestige out of the Balkan dispute that for five months has had Europe on the anxious seat.

Considered a Bluff.

The entire affair is now looked upon as a huge bluff on the part of Austria, with Germany's support tacitly understood. She kept her nerve longer than the other powers, and won out.

Leaving Serbia out of consideration, Russia is the power that has suffered the greatest humiliation, with England and France close seconds.

Russia's complete breakdown is a confession of her fear of a conflict with Austria.

In the meantime, the armament of the various powers is likely to go on an increased rate, owing to the fear of startling developments under the expected domineering attitude of Germany and Austria.

Serbs May Revolt.

BELGRADE, March 28.—A deep undercurrent of discontent pervades the Serbian capital today as a result of the acceptance by the national assembly of Crown Prince George's renunciation of his throne, and the transfer of the title of heir apparent to his younger brother, Alexander.

Under ordinary circumstances Prince George's removal would have been a matter of general rejoicing, but the overwhelming desire of Serbia's national aspirations, which, despite his dissipation, were typified in Prince George, has aroused a wave of sympathy for the young man, King Peter and leading friends of the administration are urging the deposed Crown Prince for the welfare of the country to try to placate his friends, who, it is readily conceded, could be led to revolt.

Russia Backs Minister. ST. PETERSBURG, March 28.—For the present at least the government will stand firmly by Foreign Minister Iswolsky in the storm of opposition that has arisen over what is termed the humiliation to Russia in the final plans for peace in the Balkans.

That Iswolsky has played a weak hand from start to finish and discredited the foreign office with other chancelleries, is not denied.

Eventually it is feared that Iswolsky will be forced out, for never was a man so roundly condemned as he is being now. In Slav circles the feeling is so intense that the authorities have decided to maintain a guard over the foreign office building.

Gives Car Credit.

BERLIN, March 28.—Emperor Nicholas was given praise as being the chief force in the peaceful settlement of the Balkan dispute by Chancellor Von Buelow today in a debate in the Reichstag on Germany's foreign policy.

"The czar alone prevented war," the chancellor said. "As a result of the ending of the crisis the relations of Germany with England and France are improved. Those who always stand ready to spread alarm over the supposed imminent attitude of Germany to France and England will be sorely disappointed at this outcome. The whole European outlook is more favorable than it has been for years."

NEW CONSTITUTION SOON TO BE READY

The next meeting of the Federal Labor Union, composed for the most part of women employees of the Bureau of Engraving and Printing, will be held April 15. It is expected that by this time the constitution will be ready for signature.

More than 150 new members were taken into the union at a meeting yesterday afternoon. The membership is now 52. Before the next meeting, much work will be done by the various leaders in the perfection of the constitution.

EIGHTH MURDER IN LACKAWANNA

SCRANTON, Pa., March 28.—Lackawanna's eighth murder for the year was committed at Carbondale, when Tony Giuliano shot Tony Allelo, his successful rival for the hand of Rosalie Molinaro.

Ever since Allelo and Rosalie were married, Giuliano has had a grudge against his rival, and while getting their pay at the mine where they worked he killed him. Giuliano surrendered and was placed in jail.

THEODORE, JR., IS GIVEN A PARTY

HARTFORD, Conn., March 28.—Theodore Roosevelt, Jr., and Miss Carrie A. Munn, of Washington, to whom it was reported he was engaged, have been guests at a house party given at the Country Club near Farmington, about twelve miles west of this city.

What Congress Did IN THE SENATE.

Senate Democrats objected to the fact that the tariff bill was being considered by the majority, members of the Finance Committee without the minority being present at the sessions. Senator Elkins of West Virginia made a bitter speech against the domination of the Finance Committee by New England members and the shaping of the tariff bill in the interest of New England.

A considerable amount of routine business was transacted and a number of bills introduced.


