

STUDENT MARKSMEN WIN TIMES TROPHY

Cup Goes to Second Battalion of Washington High School Cadets.

Keen rivalry marked the rifle shooting of the battalion teams of the Washington High School Cadets for the Washington Times trophy at Winter's Armory last night.

After one of the most closely contested matches of the meet, the Second Battalion, representing the Business and Western High Schools, won the cup, with a total score of 454 out of a possible 500.

Winning Team. The winning team was made up of J. C. Dulin, 96; J. E. Gordon, 89; J. D. Keane, 94; A. F. Garner, 85; R. S. Nash, 88.

The Times not only presents the winning team with a silver cup, but each member is given a bronze medal. The conditions specify that each team shall be composed of five men.

The cup, according to the conditions under which it was presented, is to be shot for annually, and is to become the property of the battalion winning it three times, but not successively.

CLARENDON SALES OF VALUABLE SITES

Virginia Real Estate Takes Boom as New Residence Section.

Sales of unimproved lots, as well as the letting of contracts for the erection of a large number of residences, are features that have brought Clarendon, Virginia, into prominence this spring, from a real estate point of view.

During the past six years Clarendon, which is the center of the rapidly growing section across the river in Alexandria county, has experienced a remarkable building development. 
