HILLS AND COPPERS LEAD MARKET TO VERY STRONG CLOSING.

GOSSIP OF DAY.

NEW YORK, May 22.—Close.—The volume of business was moderately large, and the short Saturday session, while not especially satisfactory to the bulls was not at all encouraging to the bears.

Hills Become Leaders. While the early trading was chiefly in the old leaders the Hills developed better strength in the second hour, when they assumed the position of leaders of the list.

Old Leaders Less Active. Union Pacific, Southern Pacific and Reading moved more slowly after the first hour, the other Pacific, Illinois Central, Consolidated Gas, and Missouri Pacific attracting the most attention.

Coppers in a Boom. In the industry the steels got a fine start, touching 98 1/2 and 120, and then they became dull, and very firm in their quietness.

FINANCIAL GOSSIP. Harriman & Co.—While the market continued narrow during the first half hour or so it gained in strength under the leadership of important stocks.

PHILIPPINE CAPITOL BEGUN

MANILA, May 22.—The cornerstone of the Philippine capitol was laid here. Senator Osmena, president of the assembly, expressed the belief that the structure would be the seat of a free government for the Philippines. Vice Governor Forbes said that independence was a goal to be reached by providing that the people were capable of self-government.
