which had serious permanent results; there have been fatal accidents here during the course of the ordinary drills, in gym work, swimming, and boating. Under these circumstances it is not believed football will be retired as a local sport. The accidents to Byrne and Wilson are regarded as exceptional, and football is not considered as possessing any greater element of danger than other sports, or even in the ordinary drills.

Nearly all the officers of the navy, including Superintendent Bowyer, are hearty advocates of football.

Wilson the Same.
It was reported at the Naval Hospital this morning that Earl D. Wilson, the champion football player, had passed a comfortable night and there was no change for the worse. This has been the report for two full days and the attending surgeons are more encouraged than at any time since the accident. Wilson's pulse, temperature, and respiration remain about normal, but there has been no diminution of the paralysis. A consultation will take place this week as to whether an operation will be reasonably safe. The fact is that Wilson will not be able to stand an anesthetic, but if by operation the pressure on the spinal cord can be removed, Wilson stands a good chance of recovery.

The games still on the Academy schedule to be played at Annapolis are: November 6, Washington and Jefferson College; November 12, Western Reserve; November 20, Davidson College.

MILITARY HONORS FOR DEAD CADET

WEST POINT, N. Y., Nov. 1.—Cadet Eugene A. Byrne, West Point football tackle, who died from injuries received in Saturday's game with Harvard, will be buried with military honors in the Academy cemetery tomorrow morning.

The funeral services will be held in the Catholic Church and will be in charge of Father O'Keefe, of the Church of the Sacred Heart. The body, with the Stars and Stripes as its shroud, will be borne to the cemetery on a caisson. The caisson will be pulled by a squad of members of the fourth year class, of which Byrne belonged, with seven as pallbearers.

All the post officers will attend the funeral, as will delegates from the Harvard Club of New York. At the grave three volleys will be fired.

John A. Byrne, ex-chief of police of Buffalo, the father of the dead football player, who, with his daughter, was present at the game and witnessed the fatal accident, is again greatly distressed. Wives of the officers tried to console her, but the task was beyond them.

The death of Byrne has thrown a shadow over the entire Academy and officers and cadets alike, drilled to meet life's tragedies, move quietly about with stern set faces.

There will be no more football at the Academy this year. In fact, football will not be discussed again this year and the selection of a captain for the 1910 eleven, in the event that football is continued, will not be made until next fall.

With Byrne's death uppermost in the minds of every one, many are urging that the game be permanently abandoned. The big majority of the cadets, however, are hoping that the authorities will not place its ban upon the game.

The injury to Byrne is now declared to have been the fracture of the third cervical vertebrae, the injury being almost identical to that of Midget and Earl D. Wilson, of the Annapolis team, who is now supposed to be in a dying condition. In Wilson's case the fifth cervical vertebrae that was broken.

Byrne lived fourteen hours after his injury and was conscious, but a few seconds of this time.

Scores of messages of sympathy have been received, a number coming from the football team and officers at Annapolis.

It is expected the Government will send some one from the War Department to attend the funeral in an official capacity.

NO WORD AT PENN ABOUT THE GAME

PHILADELPHIA, Nov. 1.—No definite information received by the Athletic authorities of the University of Pennsylvania with reference to the cancelling of the annual football game between the Army and Navy elevens, which is scheduled to take place on Franklin Field on the Saturday following Thanksgiving Day.

The message of Commander Scott, of West Point to the superintendent at Annapolis stated that out of respect to the memory of Cadet Byrne West Point desired to cease playing football for the remainder of the season.

To the members of the University of Pennsylvania athletic committee this decision does not mean that there will be a cancellation of the greatest game of the year. Should the Annapolis authorities look at the matter from the same viewpoint as the West Point commander it is more than possible that Secretary of War Dickinson would agree to the postponement of all future contests this year.

Dr. J. William White, medical head of all athletics at Pennsylvania, in an interview said the Army and Navy game had not been canceled, and that Pennsylvania would continue its arrangement for the playing of the game until they were officially notified of the cancellation.

Pennsylvania's athletic committee only last Thursday began preparations for the Army-Navy contest. Letters were sent out to the graduates informing them applications for tickets would be received and considered up to November 8. The cost of mailing the letters is the only expense the University authorities has borne to date. John C. Gubin, who looks after the business end of the work of the Athletic committee, said that applications for tickets were received and acted upon until an order of an adverse nature is received from the War Department.

FOOTBALL DEATH LIST IS GROWING

NEW YORK, Nov. 1.—Three deaths resulting from last Saturday's football games have served to call attention to the fact that this season promises to furnish the largest list of deaths and accidents in the history of football.

Already there have been seven deaths, with the most fiercely contested games yet to be played. The deaths include Cadet Eugene A. Byrne, of West Point; Michael Burke, of the Medico-Chirurgical College, of Philadelphia; Roy Soybeck, a Haskell University Indian; Raymond P. Thurston, Cambridge, Mass.; Clarence Ferris, Wilmington, Del.; Charles B. Kilsam, and Win Ludgen, Woodland, Cal.


