

ANDREW CARNEGIE GUEST AT BANQUET

Tribute Paid to Founder of
Institution—New Building
Was Opened Today.

The new administration building of the Carnegie Institute at Sixteenth and P streets northwest was opened to the public at 2 o'clock this afternoon. There was a large number of visitors and members of a reception committee showed them about the building.

The last of the formal functions before finally opening the new building to the public was a banquet at the New Willard Hotel last night. It was a tribute to the founder, Andrew Carnegie, by the men of letters and science connected with the institution. Mr. and Mrs. Carnegie were the guests of honor, and among those gathered around the board with them were Senator and Mrs. Ellihu Root, John S. Billings, Mr. and Mrs. Robert S. Woodward, Prof. and Mrs. George E. Hale, Mr. and Mrs. Lyman J. Gage, Seth Low, and some thirty-three others prominent in the intellectual world.

Yesterday afternoon at a meeting of the trustees of the institute there was voted for the different departments the sum of \$22,500. Mr. Carnegie will be consulted as to the manner in which the money will be spent.

Attorney General Wickersham was elected a trustee and several others, including President Taft, whose terms had expired, were re-elected. The members of the executive committee and the officers of the board were re-elected with out opposition. The following men were chosen to serve on the finance committee: Trustees Seth Low, C. L. Higginson, and H. S. Pritchett.

Previous to the meeting of the trustees there was a luncheon served by thirty members of the institution and their families in one of the reception rooms adjoining the main hall.

SIX HOUSES SOLD BY ONE CONCERN

Another Firm Sells Same
Property Three Times for
Different Owners.

Concluding the sale of a row of six houses at approximately \$50,000, Bell, O'Brien & Co., Inc., has sold to James W. French the new residence, at 3220 Thirteenth street northwest. The house is a three-story stone and brick structure. It contains ten rooms and two baths.

For a price said to have been \$4,500, Willige, Gibbs & Daniel has sold to Mrs. A. Caroline Morris premises 123 V street northwest, between First street and Flagler place. The house is one of a row of Roman brick buildings built by Harry Wardman several years ago. The purchaser is Mrs. Mary E. Chandler, who intends to occupy it.

The transaction makes the third time Willige, Gibbs & Daniel has sold the house.

Dr. A. E. Powell has purchased the lot at 105 Thirteenth street southeast, which has a frontage of 15 feet by a depth of 100 feet. The sale was made through the office of Mrs. Mary E. Chandler. The price is said to have been \$5,500.
