

PAINTINGS WANTED BY LEOPOLD HERE

NEW YORK, Dec. 18.—An art collector King Leopold II gathered together in his palaces at Brussels and Laeken a large number of old masters of the Dutch and Flemish schools and a great array of canvases by modern painters, Belgian and other.

Canvases Once in the Royal Palaces of Belgium Are in Kleinberger Gallery.

Recently he decided to sell almost all of his collections. He commenced by privately disposing of his old paintings, including the celebrated Rubens representing the martyrdom of St. Lawrence, which had been purchased for him at the sale of the Tenue collection at Lill.

Among the many fine works in the new gallery are a Van Dyck, a Goya, and a Rubens, all large and important canvases.


