TARGET PRACTICE SCORES ARE HIGH

DIPLOMATIC BREAK IS MADE COMPLETE

Monaco's Minister to Vatican Notified He Is "Non Grata."

ROME, April 25.—The break between Pope Pius X and the Prince of Monaco was made complete today when the ruler of Monte Carlo reached Rome.

The Monaco minister to the Vatican, Count Wagner, was notified that he was no longer persona grata. This led to the definite severance of all relations between Monaco and the church.

The prince was received with royal honors by the Quirinal. King Victor Emmanuel paid him a formal call. The anticlerical press gives prominence to the failure of the prince to visit the Vatican.
