

CENSUS BUREAU'S WAGES INCREASE SALARIES

About 250 Employees Are Promoted, As Promised. By Director Durand.

TWO ARE ADVANCED TO THE \$1,800 CLASS

Many \$600 Employees Are Raised to \$720, Which They Expected to Receive When Employed.

Director of the Census Durand announced today the promotion of about 250 clerks in his bureau, to be immediately effective. The promotions range principally from the \$600 grade to the fourth class, which carries with it a salary of \$1,200.

The most important advances were those of John W. Curry, of Oregon, and Arthur J. Hirsch, of Illinois, from \$1,600 a year to \$1,800. There were nine clerks advanced from \$1,400 to \$1,600; fifteen from \$1,200 to \$1,400; twenty-three from \$1,000 to \$1,200; and the remainder were below the \$900 grade.

The large number of advances from \$600 to \$720 classes is looked upon as an evidence of the good faith of Director Durand, who announced some time ago that those entering the service at \$600 would be promoted within a reasonable period. The list in detail follows:

BREWERS' LEADERS MEET INFORMALLY

Preliminaries of Convention Arranged by Delegates of Executives' Association.

A meeting of the interstate executive association of the United Brewers' Association, informally opened the fifth convention of that organization at the New Willard Hotel this morning at 10 o'clock.

The interstate executive association is composed of the executive officers of the State and local organizations. The meeting today was merely for an exchange of greetings and suggestions of plans for the formal opening which takes place tomorrow morning at 10 o'clock.

A brief discussion of local conditions and an exchange of experiences were indulged in today at the meeting presided over by John Gardner, of Philadelphia, chairman of the "inside" association. Forty State and local associations from all over the country were represented by about 100 members. It is the first time the interstate executive association has met in connection with the big cool issues, higher license and stronger local control.

With arrivals coming into Washington on every train the attendance was expected to reach its full membership of about 500 by this afternoon, when many of the delegates and visitors had planned to spend the time between the preliminary work of the convention and the discussions tomorrow.

Discussions Tomorrow.
The Brewers' Association, which represents about seventy-five per cent of the output of the country, will begin the discussion of its most important subjects tomorrow afternoon. These will be plans for stricter regulation of saloons and complete elimination and eradication of all distillable features. One method of attaining a near perfection as possible, according to several brewers who were informally discussing this feature today, is a stricter observance of excise laws, more rigid enforcement of these laws by the police departments of cities and states, and, as purely local issues, higher license and stronger local control.

Boutell to Speak.
The principal speaker tomorrow morning will be Representative Boutell, of Chicago. In the afternoon Holman Day, magazine writer and author, will deliver an address.

It is thought probable that a committee will be appointed some time during the convention to arrange for an appropriate celebration at next year's convention. The place for holding the meeting next year will not be decided until the spring. While this is the fifth convention of the brewers, the half century birthday anniversary does not come until next year. With one exception, conventions have been held once a year.

KAISER IS GRANTED LARGER ALLOWANCE
No Opposition to \$875,000 Increase Save From Socialist Members.

BERLIN, June 7.—In the face of a violent attack by the socialist members, the Prussian diet today passed on first reading the government bill to increase the Kaiser's yearly allowance from \$4,000,000 to \$4,875,000. Only the six socialist members voted against the measure.

CARPENTERS' STRIKE CARPENTERS DEADLOCKED

Both Union Men and Employers Are Claiming Victory.

BUILDERS AGREE, ASSERT LEADERS

President Parsons Denies That Any Material Concessions Have Been Made.

With both the carpenters and their employers claiming victory, there is but little change in the strike situation today.

At the offices of the strike committee in the Hutchins building, it is stated today that the union men had won out in their fight for a Saturday half holiday and an increase in wages to 54 cents per hour.

Business Agent Crosby, of the Brotherhood of Carpenters and Joiners, said this morning that seven builders agreed last night to the terms of the Union and that their men returned to work this morning. Within the next few days, in the opinion of Mr. Crosby, all of the men will be back at their jobs with an increase in wages and the half holiday Saturday.

At the offices of the builders a different version of the situation was given out.

James Parsons, president of the Builders' League, denied positively that any of the leading builders and contractors had acceded to the demands of the union. In explaining the situation Mr. Parsons said:

"Several months ago we were requested by the Brotherhood of Carpenters, the Building Trades Council, and the Amalgamated Carpenters Branch for a half holiday on Saturday the year around, and later the Brotherhood of Carpenters asked for an increase of 10 per cent in pay. This demand was refused, with the result that the men struck yesterday. A meeting of practically all of the builders in the city was held yesterday afternoon, and it was again decided not to grant the increase in pay. From the reports received at that meeting it is estimated that there are nearly 400 men out today, of which number all but about twenty-five are members of the Brotherhood. The builders," continued Mr. Parsons, "have no intention of granting the increase in pay, but are willing to give the Saturday half holiday."

The members of the Master Builders and the Employers Association have been running an "open shop" for several years, and a few of these builders are employing non-union carpenters.

Another meeting of the builders will be held this evening, at which time a conference will be held with the strike committee.
